- She established the first Children's Art Program and Library, still sponsored by the Lake Chapala Society today, that helped to launch the careers of many local artists and professionals. 8 of the ~15 galleries in Ajijic belong to Neill James' students.

Indices Difference

- Consumer Prices in Mexico are 51.57% lower than in United States (without rent)
- Consumer Prices Including Rent in Mexico are 58.55% lower than in United States
- Rent Prices in Mexico are 71.92% lower than in United States
- Restaurant Prices in Mexico are 58.45% lower than in United States
- Groceries Prices in Mexico are 52.41% lower than in United States
- Local Purchasing Power in Mexico is 65.43% lower than in United States

- Consumer Prices Including Rent in Mexico are 54.47% lower than in Canada
- Rent Prices in Mexico are 64.46% lower than in Canada
- Restaurant Prices in Mexico are 55.04% lower than in Canada
- Groceries Prices in Mexico are 51.06% lower than in Canada
- Local Purchasing Power in Mexico is 57.24% lower than in Canada

- Average Home prices \$125k - \$500k USD
- Property taxes are low! Average \$200/YEAR
- Average Rent \$600 - \$1,500
- Utilities lower (no or little A.C. or heat needed)
- Health Care (& Health Insur) costs at 30-60% vs. US
- Groceries 20-60% lower (weekly organic market)

- Guadalajara airport less expensive for international travel
- Massage: \$350-\$500 pesos an hour
- Manicure & Pedicure together \$300 pesos/ \$16 USD
- First run movies in English \$40-50 pesos/ \$2.50 USD
- Haircut: \$100-\$150 pesos/\$5-\$8 USD
- Hair color: \$350-400 pesos/\$18 -\$21 USD

Where Day to Day Savings Can Really Add Up!

- Maid: \$50 pesos per hr/ = about \$2.75 USD per hr
- Gardener: \$300 pesos per day/ \$16 USD per day
- Nice dinner for two with wine and tip: \$600 pesos/\$35 USD
- Thermal Water pools entrance fee: \$250-\$400/ \$13-\$21 USD
- Doctor/Specialist: \$300-\$700 pesos/\$16-35 USD
- Assisted Living/Nursing Homes: \$1,500-\$2,500/mo USD (depending on level of care needed)
- Mexico's Senior Discount Cards (DIF) offer even lower costs

AMERICANS IN MEXICO


- Over 44 million foreign visitors in 2019 (41.4 in 2018)
- As many as 2.5 million+ U.S. citizens live there, (Stratfor estimate)
- Did you know?
 - Americans a year killed (violent crime in Mexico) = 0.00033% (about 80 - 120)
 - Majority in crime infested border towns + many are dual citizens Mex/US

Mexico: Causes of Death for American Tourists, June 2017-June 2018

Homicides in Mexico have hit historic highs, but very few have involved American tourists. From June 2017 to June 2018, around 35 million Americans visited Mexico, but only 238 died there.









- Recent increase in Cartel turf wars
- Mexican drug cartels 'operating in the [UK, France & Netherlands](#)'
- Sinaloa Drug Cartel is now in the [Philippines and Worldwide](#) with crime groups in [Europe, West Africa, Asia, Central America, South America, United States](#)
- Mexican president has discussed finding new ways to tackle drugs trade, including the possibility of legalisation with regulation.

BUT CARTEL VIOLENCE IS REAL 1/26/2021

- Mexico-wide, incidents have been on the rise
- Turf Wars continue – but it's Cartel vs. Cartel
- Lake Chapala area occasional- but more so GDL
- President AMLO promised a new approach BUT no result yet
- Gruesome headlines are bound to continue
- Retired Gringos not a target

COVID-19 RISKS IN MEXICO

- Mexico is seeing high numbers of cases and deaths
- BUT testing levels are very low. "Multiply by 10"
- Lower incomes and safety nets mean most Mexicans must work to survive
- New travel restrictions to return to US/CDA will impact Mexico







Mexican Requirements for an M.D.

- No PRE-MED requirement or National testing vs U.S. (MCAT)
- Medical School 4 years (normal to start at age 19 vs. 28 in the U.S.)
- Internship 1 year (aka INTERNADO)
- Social Service 1 year
- **PROFESSIONAL EXAM** (required for Licensure) – Some M.D.'s (GPs) don't have it or need it for employment
- **ENARM (National SPECIALTY BOARD EXAMINATION)**. Required to enter into specialty programs
- Specialty 4 years
- Sub-specialty 2 - 4 years

Specialization & Continuing Education

- Certification Exam – (Certification by the Medical Counsels/Consejos aka BOARDS)
- Re-certification every 5 years
- Fellowships (U.S. & Europe)
- CME (Continuing Medical Education) NOT REQUIRED TO MAINTAIN LICENSURE only CERTIFICATION
 - Seminars
 - Teaching
 - Publications
 - Research
- **MALPRACTICE INSURANCE IS NOT REQUIRED** for Licensure and it is a difficult and costly process to sue a doctor in Mexico.

- Involvement of Friends/Family
 - Expected to be present during consults and procedures
- Position of Elders in Family & Society
 - Live with family until death.
 - Normal to see 3-4 generations living under 1 roof
- Assisted Living & Nursing Care
 - "New" to Mexican Society and still rare
- Care in Hospitals
 - Nurses: Change IV's and give meds
 - Family: Feed, cloth & bath patient
 - "Visiting" hours & 24 hour presence of family/friend





Medication Availability

- How medications are sold in Mexico
 - BOXES usually for 7, 14 & 28 days of treatment vs.
 - Numbered pills in plastic vials (U.S.)
- What medications need Rx's?
 - Sedative/Hypnotics: Xanax & Ambien
 - Antibiotics: Penicillin's, Anti-Fungals
 - Opioid Pain Medications: Morphine, Hydrocodone, Codeine
- Availability of Medications –
 - Highly variable (i.e. Warfarin)
 - Most pharmacies will order and/or deliver meds



HEALTHCARE RECOMMENDATIONS

- Establish care with a Primary Care Doctor
 - AVOID UNNECESSARY TESTING & PROCEDURES.
 - SAVE MONEY AND TIME
 - COORDINATION OF ALL YOUR SPECIALISTS
- Get a PRIVATE insurance policy that meets your needs and addresses your risks identified by your PCP
 - What are you most likely to spend your money on healthcare wise ?
- Set up an EMERGENCY/HOSPITAL CARE plan with your family/friends and PCP
 - What hospital suits your wants vs. needs ? Who will stay with you ?

HEALTHCARE RECOMMENDATIONS

- Get your regularly scheduled medical check-ups
 - Best way to avoid hospitalization is early detection of most diseases and preventative care
